Welcome to Horsham Township's 2017 Community Guide! Established in 1717, Horsham Township is a diverse community of over 26,000 residents, conveniently located in Montgomery County, Pa. The year of 2017 marks the 300th year that Horsham Township has been established. This calls for a celebration, a yearlong celebration, filled with a variety of events and activities for residents to enjoy! Starting as a settlement of William Penn's and shortly thereafter sold to Samuel Carpenter the township has evolved from a rural countryside to one of the most desirable suburban communities for people to live.

In 2016, Horsham was ranked as one of the safest communities in Pennsylvania, according to the FBI's annual Uniform Crime Report. In 2014, CNN Money Magazine ranked Horsham as the 34th best place to live in the United States. So, why is Horsham Township continually recognized? We have beautiful parks, a township-wide trail system, modern retail centers featuring high-quality restaurants, Blue Ribbon recognized Hatboro-Horsham School District, wonderful neighborhoods and homes to satisfy any budget, low crime rate, many active local civic organizations that make great contributions to the community, and high-end office parks with Fortune 500 companies that give back to the community with their active promotion of public service among their employees.

We have worked diligently to keep taxes low and services steady. It is important to us to continue to make decisions which improve the quality of life, plan for the future generations and maintain our Township's character. In order to continuously improve Horsham's high quality of life, we have built two firehouses, a public library, a community center, a public works facility, and a new police station. The township also maintains 6 community parks, 10 neighborhood parks, and many miles of trails for Horsham Residents to enjoy. These milestones have still been accomplished without increasing taxes for over 15 years. Horsham Township is known to be one of the lowest tax rates in Montgomery County, PA.

Our township, our residents and our businesses deserve the highest levels of service and an unparalleled quality of life, which is all possible because Horsham Township is the best place to live, work, and play. It is our hope that you will enjoy and keep this community guide as a keepsake of the Tricentennial and a useful resource of information about our community.

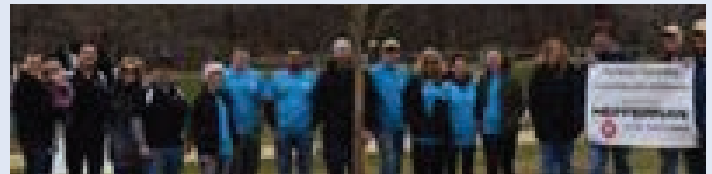

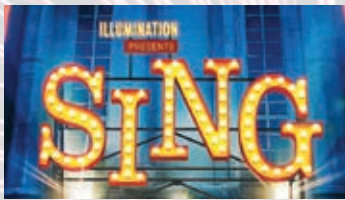

HORSHAM TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENT

Horsham Township is a municipality of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The Home Rule Charter of Horsham Township went into effect in January of 1976. The Charter prescribed that there shall be five Council Members, elected at large, for a four-year term.

The Legislative power of the Township is vested with Council. The Council adopts legislation and grants final approval of many of the functions of Township Government at their regular monthly meetings. These meetings provide an opportunity for communication with the public, which is essential to a successful local government. The meetings are generally held in the Township Building.

HORSHAM TOWNSHIP MANAGER

The Township Manager, appointed by Township Council, is responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations of the Township. In addition to long-range planning and fiscal management, the Manager implements all policies, ordinances, resolutions and other official directives of the Township Council. The manager also assists citizens in finding information about Township services, handling citizen complaints and managing a comprehensive public information program.

The Finance Department is responsible for the preparation of the annual budget, the collection and accurate accounting of all revenues from taxes and other sources, the processing of all payroll and accounts payable obligations of the Township, and for the prudent investment of all funds held by the Township. The Township is subject to an audit performed by a certified public accounting firm at the end of every fiscal year.

IMPORTANT TAX INFORMATION

There are three taxing jurisdictions to which Horsham property owners pay: Horsham Township, Montgomery County and Hatboro-Horsham School District. The real estate tax is based on a millage rate levied each year by the respective governing bodies of those jurisdictions. The Horsham Township real estate tax is set by the Township Council in December each year as part of the annual budget process. Horsham Township Council has continued to approve 1 mill tax for over 15 years, one of the lowest tax rates in Montgomery County. Horsham Township's 1 mill tax is divided throughout the township as follows: The Fire Company receives .31 mills, the Parks & Recreation Department receives .22 mills, and the Library receives .47 mills. The School District tax is set each Spring by the Hatboro-Horsham Board of School Directors based upon their projected budget for the year. Montgomery County tax is voted on by the Montgomery County Commissioners in January of each year. For questions on your tax bill contact the department of which your question applies.



EARNED INCOME TAX

Horsham Township levies an Earned Income Tax at a rate of 1%, on residents and non-resident employed in the township. The resident tax rate is shared equally with the Hatboro-Horsham School District. The tax is based on the same earnings as taxed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Residents of the township are required to file an annual tax return showing that the taxes due have been withheld by their employer properly and/or that they have made the appropriate estimated payments throughout the year. The due date for the annual return is the same as that used by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

If the tax is not withheld by your employer and your annual income is \$12,000 or more, you are required to make quarterly estimated payments throughout the year. The due dates for each are: 4/30, 7/30, 10/30 and 01/30 of the subsequent year.

The township also has a low income exemption in place for Earned income Tax purposes. The exemption is \$5,000 in income. If you make less than \$5,000 of income in a tax year you have the right to file for a refund of the taxes withheld on that amount.

Horsham Township also levies an Local Services Tax on those that are employed within the township. The tax rate is \$52.00 per year and is payable at a rate of \$1.00 per week of employment in the township. Payments for such are remitted quarterly.

Both the Earned Income and Local Services Tax are collected at this time by BERKHEIMER TAX INNOVATIONS. Information and forms for use to file the returns that are due can be found on their website at www.hab-inc.com or obtained by phone by calling 610-599-3139.

ONLINE TAX PAYMENTS

Horsham Township is now accepting Real Estate Tax payments online. Accepted payment types are Visa, MasterCard, Discover and ACH (automatic withdrawal from a checking account). There's a small fee charged by a third party service provider for using this service and is not retained by the Township.

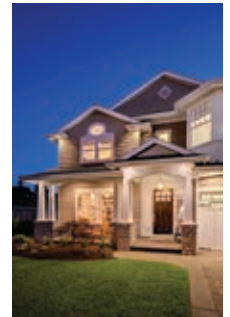

REAL ESTATE TAX BILL:

Real Estate Tax bills for Horsham Township and Montgomery County will be mailed by March 1st. The tax bill provides a portion of the necessary income for the Township to run effectively. Payment periods are as follows:

- 2% Discount**
- Face (full amount)**
- 10% Penalty**
- Pay tax bill by April 30**
- May 1- June 30**
- July 1 - December 31**

Postmarks within the stated deadlines are accepted; and deadlines that fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, are due on the next business day. The deadline for the payment of real estate taxes to Horsham Township is by 12:00 noon on December 31st, and failure to pay by that deadline results in a lien being placed on the property and collection through the Montgomery County Tax Claim Bureau.

CODE & ZONING ENFORCEMENT

The Code Enforcement Department provides for the administration of the Uniform Construction Code (PA Act 45), Township Zoning Ordinance, and Property Maintenance Code. The Department works to ensure all properties are developed, constructed, and maintained in a manner which brings value to the residents, businesses, and visitors of the Township while ensuring regulatory compliance, encouraging community pride, protecting the public health and well-being, and maintaining property values.

The Code Enforcement Department helps manage the growth of Horsham Township by reviewing construction applications along with helping residents and builders meet code requirements.

Horsham Township requires a building permit prior to all construction or improvements, including additions, alterations, demolition, enlargements, chimneys, patios, fireplaces or fuel burning heating appliances to include gas fired fireplaces, inserts, pellet stoves, etc., porches, swimming pools, roofing/siding, finished basements (requires egress door/window) and new or movement of plumbing. Building permit applications are available at the municipal building from 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Completed applications must be submitted to the Zoning Officer and Building Inspector for review. The resident is notified when the permit has been issued and is ready for pickup. The permit holder is responsible to notify the Township when the required inspections are ready to be performed by the Building Inspector. PROPERTY MAINTENANCE & PERMITS IN HORSHAM TOWNSHIP

Smoke Detectors

All homes should have smoke detectors in the appropriate amount and locations, including every bedroom.



House Numbers

Must be a minimum of 4 inches high and visible from the street.

Sheds

Sheds require a zoning permit. There are setback requirements for sheds dependent upon the zoning district. Applications are available online or from the Township's Planning & Zoning Officer and require a plot plan with measurements showing where the shed will be placed on the property. In addition to the plot plan, two copies of design specifications or brochures are required.



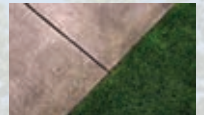
Decks

Decks, concrete patios, and paver patios require a permit.



Sidewalks

Property owners are responsible for sidewalk maintenance. In addition to maintenance all sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours following a snow storm.



Drainage



It is illegal for downspouts, floor drains and sump pumps to drain into the sanitary sewer system.

Fence

All Fences require a permit. There are specifications on height and type of fences permitted. Contact the Codes Department for a fence permit application.



Property Maintenance

Trees and shrubs shall not have overhanging limbs onto the sidewalk area maintaining a minimum clearance of 8 feet above the walking surface and minimum of 14 feet clearance above the street. Grass shall not exceed 6 inches in high.



SOLICITING IN HORSHAM TOWNSHIP

Door to door sales in Horsham Township require a permit. All Solicitors must have a photo ID issued by the Horsham Police Department. Solicitors must carry and display a Police issued ID along with a PA Driver's License or PA Identification card at all times. Soliciting is only permitted Monday through Saturday during daylight hours. No Soliciting on Sundays or State or Federal Holidays. Contact the Horsham Police Department at 215-643-3600 to report any unlicensed solicitor or suspicious person.

COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The community and economic development department is responsible as the primary point of contact for business and commercial property owners in the township. It is tasked with engaging the Horsham business community and encouraging business and employment within the township. Additionally, the Director of Community and Economic Development is also tasked with encouraging the vision, development and redevelopment outlined in the Township's Business Parks Master Plan and in concert with the HLRA, the Redevelopment Plan approved for the Willow Grove Naval Air station property.

HORSHAM LAND REUSE AUTHORITY

NAS JRB WILLOW GROVE BASE

Horsham Township was home to the NAS JRB Willow Base for many years and is a positive memory throughout the community. Many remember the air shows hosted upon the base while others are proud to call NASJRB home for their military career. In 2005, Congress approved the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Report recommending that NAS-JRB Willow Grove be closed. BRAC is the process that allows the Department of Defense to transform its infrastructure to meet the future needs of the military. Despite an effort by former Governor Ed Rendell to create a state owned facility at the base, the base was closed in 2011.



The Horsham Land Redevelopment Authority (HLRA) is the implementing local reuse authority responsible for redeveloping the former Naval Air Station-Joint Reserve Base (NAS-JRB) Willow Grove property. The HLRA received official recognition from the Department of Defense as the local redevelopment authority for purposes of implementing the local redevelopment plan at the former base.

The HLRA Board members are valuable constituents of our local community that assist in the vision that Horsham Township has for the 862 surplus acres. One of the biggest accomplishments thus far is the redevelopment of the Horsham Memorial U.S. Army Reserve Center that is now the home of the new Hallowell Elementary School.

The property was obtained from the U.S. Department of Education by the Hatboro-Horsham School District with assistance from the Horsham Land Redevelopment Authority via a public benefit conveyance. The new elementary school provides the latest technology and resources for students.

It has been a priority of the HLRA to inform and involve local citizens in the redevelopment plan. Many residents of Horsham participated in public meetings collecting ideas for the surplus acres. After several public meetings the HLRA Board and consultants published a conceptual plan for the redevelopment of NAS-JRB. The plan, adopted in 2012, calls for redeveloping the 862-acre parcel with approximately 1,468 residential units, 1.5 million square feet of commercial office space, a town center with retail, restaurants and apartments, a continuing care facility, and a middle school, among other uses.

The HLRA has identified a potential Master Developer to work with the HLRA and Township to bring to life the vision entailed in the approved plan for the base. In early 2015, the HLRA selected Catellus Development Corporation as the selected Master Developer candidate. Catellus brings extensive redevelopment experience, including redeveloping former base properties, expertise and capital to the project.

As part of transferring closed bases, a thorough environmental study was completed which identified areas on the base that appropriately required remediation efforts. In recent years, the EPA and Federal and State Agencies have had a growing concern regarding emerging contaminants, PFC's ("Perfluorinated Compounds"), unregulated substances that had not been previously classified as environmental contaminants. On May 19, 2016, the US EPA lowered the health advisory level for PFC's in drinking water to 70 parts per trillion. Horsham Township's leadership attacked the issue, and adopted a short-term and long-term goal of the "Horsham Standard", which would reduce PFC's to a levels well below the EPA standard. The township is well underway on the short-term solution and a long-term solution has also been approved and is being executed.

The Township, the HLRA and the Horsham Water and Sewer Authority continue discussions and meetings with the Navy, the Pennsylvania Air National Guard, the US EPA and PA DEP to devise a final remediation plan to address PFC's at the base. The Highway Division is responsible for maintenance planning and roadway construction improvement projects, general township property maintenance and improvements, and snow removal.

The Parks Division is dedicated to serving as a partner in providing essential open space, parks and services that enhance the quality of life and deliver individual, community, environmental, and economic benefits to its customers.



ROADS

Horsham Township Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining all Township roads, including salting and plowing during winter storms, patching pot holes, trimming trees, mowing road banks and more. 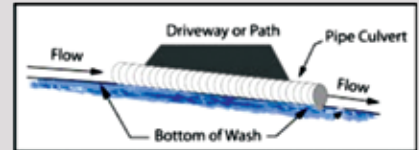

CURBS & SIDEWALKS

It is a good idea to inspect the condition of your concrete curbs, sidewalks, driveway aprons and pipes annually. These concrete areas need to be maintained throughout their life and if they get to a point of disrepair they may need to be fixed or replaced. You should be inspecting for cracks, difference in height from one block to the next, spalling or falling apart. For a complete list and explanations of what to look for please visit www.horsham.org, from the main page, select “Departments,” then “Public Works Department,” and finally “Curbs and Sidewalks” Before you or your contractor begin any work you will need to get a permit from the Code Enforcement Department, Code will also provide you a packet explaining the standards to which the repairs must be constructed. You can also find the packet, Detailed Concrete Specifications, on the Horsham Township website, www.horsham.org. Before cement is poured on your project the Public Works Department needs to be contacted to schedule an inspection, to make sure that the work is done to code. This step protects you the homeowner, it is very important that you have this completed, if this step is not completed at the proper time the permit will not be closed.

MAINTAINING DRIVEWAY CULVERTS



Driveway culverts connect open ditches on either side of a driveway. This allows water to flow under, rather than over, the driveway. The purpose is to maintain the free flow of water and not impede or reduce the water carrying capacity of the culvert or channel. Individual property owners are responsible for the structural integrity and maintenance related to having a pipe culvert under their driveway. Maintenance responsibilities on a pipe culvert or channel running under your driveway consist mainly of keeping it clean. This means free of trash, debris and sediment; clear of overgrowth, choking or clogging vegetation; free of obstructions or structures. Culverts or channels must not be filled in, plugged, blocked, diverted or altered in any way. Do not fill in or pave over open ditches. This helps avoid flooding and helps prevent icy conditions in the roadways when the temperatures are low.

SNOW REGULATIONS

Horsham Township recognizes the importance of snow removal, not only to residents, but to everyone who needs to travel to or through our community. Help us, help you during a snow event by doing the following (more tips can be found online at www.horsham.org)

- Once snow accumulates two (2) inches or more and until the roadway is cleared by the Highway Division, no vehicle, trailer, boat or camper may be parked in the roadway.
- It is impossible for snowplows to avoid having snow placed at the bottom of driveways. Unfortunately, this is the reality of snow removal. A helpful hint, that may limit the amount of snow in your driveway, is to shovel snow in driveways to the right side of the driveway (as you face the road) and clear the area immediately to the left of your driveway.

The Horsham Water and Sewer Authority is a community water and sewer system serving a population of approximately 23,000 people within the Township of Horsham. Horsham's existing water system obtains water via a subsurface supply ran by Horsham Water and Sewer Authority and purchases water from AQUA and North Wales Water Authority. It is the Authority's vision to provide water and wastewater services that meet or exceed all regulations and customer expectations at the lowest possible cost.



CONSIDER FOLLOWING THE CONSERVATION TIPS LISTED BELOW TO HELP REDUCE YOUR NEXT BILL AND LOWER THE AMOUNT OF WATER WASTED.

CONSERVATION INFORMATION:

- A leaking water fixture can waste **200 gallons each day.**
- Low-flow showerheads use 40% to 50% less water than conventional fixtures.
- Use a toilet tank dye tablet to discover silent and costly tank leaks. Fix the leak or install a low-flow toilet to save 20% to 50% of water used by conventional methods.
- A short shower saves 5 to 7 gallons per minute and uses 1/3 the amount of water a bath takes. Filling the bathtub halfway saves 10 to 15 gallons.

WATER CONSERVATION TIPS:

In the bathroom:

- Take shorter showers.
- Turn off the water while brushing your teeth or shaving.

Repair leaking faucets and toilets:

- Install low-flow aerators and showerheads.
- Don't use the toilet as a trash can – avoid unnecessary flushes

In the laundry:

- Run washing machines only when full.
- Allow heavily soiled clothes to soak in the washing machine to avoid multiple washes.

In the kitchen:

- Install a faucet aerator.
- Refrigerate a bottle of drinking water rather than running the water until it is cold enough to drink.
- Use a dishpan or fill up the sink for washing and rinsing dishes.
- Throw food waste into the trash, not the sink's garbage disposal.

Winter Water Conservation Tip:

- Winterize outdoor spigots to avoid pipes bursting from freezing

HISTORY OF HORSHAM



Horsham Township is named after the town of Horsham in West Sussex County, England. Horsham is one of several townships in Montgomery County whose name and size were determined by master survey lines drawn by William Penn's engineers as they first plotted this part of the colony for sale and settlement. Parallel lines, projected at intervals of a mile and a half and extending in a northwesterly direction from settlements along the Delaware, served not only as base lines for measurement of individual land grants but also as courses for future highways. County Line Road, Horsham Road, and Welsh Road are examples of highways so laid out. The effect of these survey lines upon the development pattern of Eastern Montgomery County is very much in evidence today.



Samuel Carpenter

In 1684, the entire township of 17 square miles was made available to individual purchasers. Samuel Carpenter, from the town of Horsham in West Sussex County, England, after which the township is named, purchased five thousand acres, forty two hundred of them within the present boundaries of the township. In 1709, Carpenter, then Treasurer of Pennsylvania, began to sell tracts of land to migrating Quakers. In 1717, Horsham Township was established as a municipal entity by a vote of the people.

In 1718, Sir William Keith, then Provincial Governor of Pennsylvania, acquired twelve hundred acres of Carpenter's land on which he erected a house in keeping with the dignity of his office. The development of Keith's "plantation" proved to be a step in establishing closer ties between Horsham and neighboring communities, particularly those of Hatboro and Willow Grove. He was responsible for the construction of the present Easton Road (U.S. Highway 611) from the old York Road junction at Willow Grove to his mansion on County Line Road in 1722.

The first significant settlement in the Township centered around the junction of Horsham and Easton Roads and was known as Horshamville. Keith's extension of Easton Road prompted the establishment of the Horsham Friends Meeting House.

The township's early social and economic life revolved around this Meeting House. In a similar way, Prospectville, originally known as Cashtown, was established at the junction of two roads, Limekiln Pike and Horsham Road. This portion of Limekiln Pike was an extension of the original segment established in 1693 to provide a thoroughfare between Old York Road and the limekilns of Thomas Fitzwater in Upper Dublin Township. Prospectville, on a high elevation point within the township, offers a resting spot with a tavern for those traveling along either Limekiln Pike or Horsham Road. Here lived several generations of the Simpson family, one of whom was the mother of Ulysses S. Grant, the 18th President of the United States.



The hamlet of Davis Grove grew at the intersection of Keith's Road (now called Governors Road) and Privet Road and was once a focal point of community life. It was here the residents of the township came to vote, discuss politics, and attend community meetings. The "Golden Ball Inn", which at one time was used for housing guests of Governor Keith, enjoyed much Revolutionary splendor. The two roads were formerly through links. Keith's Road extended from Easton Road to Keith Valley Road and Privet Road,

from Horsham Road to Easton Road. Expansion of the Willow Grove Naval Air Station caused the closing of these roads and the absorption of the hamlet. Today, there are virtually no remaining signs of the original settlement.

Through most of the early and the middle 19th Century, Horsham's population grew slowly. Its character was not altered in any significant way until about 1872, when the North Pennsylvania Railroad extended a rail line from Glenside to New Hope and established a station in the nearby community of Hatboro, two and three-quarter miles east of the nucleus of Horshamville. Horsham-Hatboro-Byberry Road provided easy access to Hatboro's station and, as a result, residential development began along the road virtually linking the two communities together. By 1890, the township's population reached 1,300.

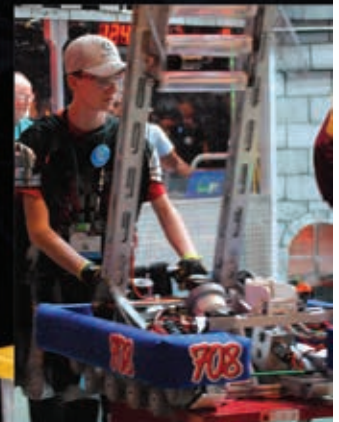

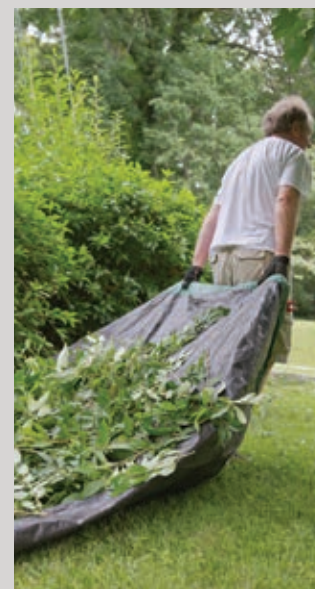

All leaf waste must be placed in biodegradable bags. This service is available to residential property owners only and we will not accept waste from landscapers or non-residential properties. The Township has brown biodegradable bags for sale at the Township Building.

Pennsylvania's 'Municipal Waste Planning Recycling and Waste Reduction Act' (Act 101) requires trash haulers to meet the following requirements in Horsham Township:

- Two collections for leaves between October 1st and December 31st.
- One collection of holiday trees during the month of January.
- One collection of shrubbery, tree trimmings and similar vegetative materials between April 1st and June 1st. (no grass)

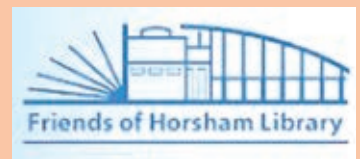

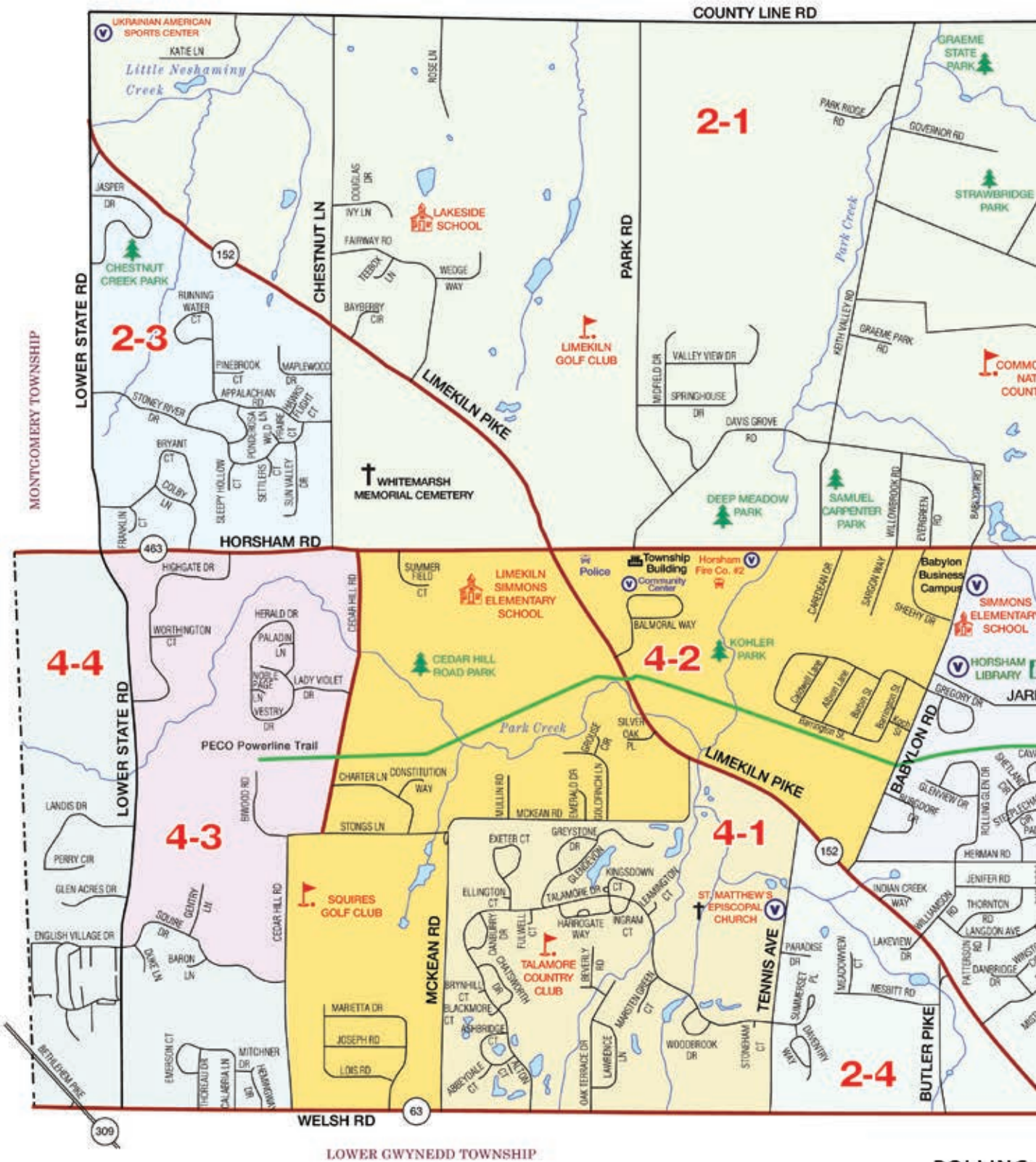

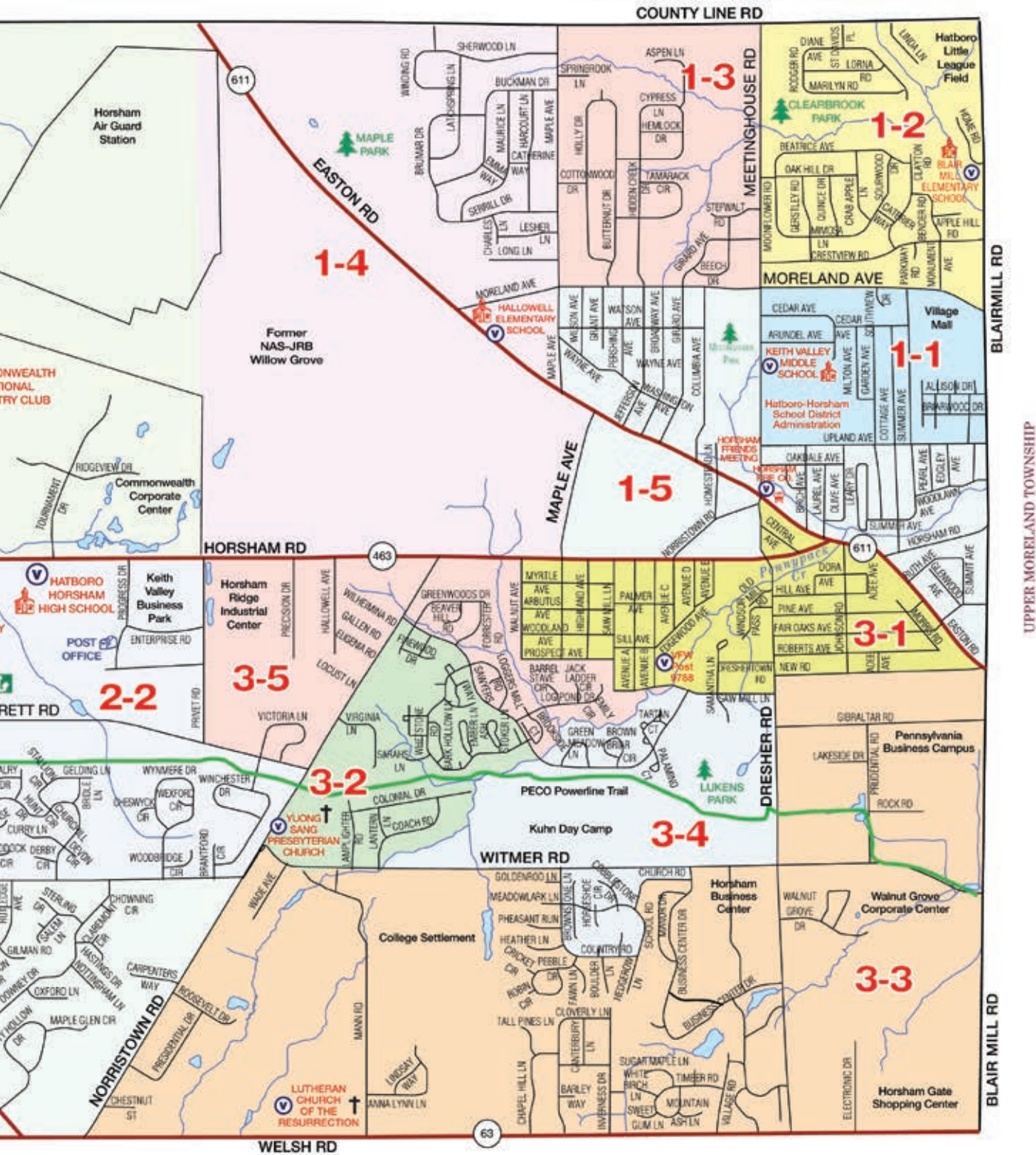

VOTING DISTRICTS

Voters cast their ballots in election districts scattered throughout the Township.

VOTER REGISTRATION

To qualify as a voter, a resident must register after meeting four requirements: (1) eighteen years of age, (2) a U.S. citizen for at least one month, (3) a resident of the election district at least 30 days, (4) a resident of Pennsylvania for at least 30 days. Electors may pick up voter registration applications at most public buildings: Municipal Centers, Libraries, Liquor Stores, Post Offices. Montgomery County Voter Services (610) 278-3280.

PRIMARY ELECTIONS

The third Tuesday in May is Primary Election Day in Pennsylvania except in presidential election years when the Primary is held on the fourth Tuesday in April.

GENERAL ELECTIONS

General Elections when state and federal offices are filled occur in even numbered years while Municipal elections, including county offices, are held in odd numbered years. Both are held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November. All elections are supervised by the County Board of Elections. The polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

STORMWATER



WHAT IS STORMWATER?

Stormwater is water runoff from precipitation that flows across the ground and pavement when it rains or when snow and ice melt. The water seeps into the ground or drains into what we call storm sewers. These are the drains you see at street corners or at low points on the sides of streets. Collectively, the draining water is called stormwater runoff.

THINGS TO HELP LIMIT STORMWATER RUNOFF VOLUME

INSTALL A RAIN GARDEN

A rain garden is a planted shallow depression designed to catch and filter rainfall runoff. The garden captures rain from a downspout or a driveway. The water sinks into the ground, aided by deep rooted plants that like wet and dry conditions. A residential rain garden should dry out between rains and should only hold water for approximately 24 hours. This timeframe prevents standing water that could create mosquito habitat.



INSTALL A RAIN BARREL

Rain barrels are installed at the bottom of your down-spouts and catch the rain water that comes off the roof. You can then reuse that water to water your garden or yard. Please try to empty your rain barrel between rain events to maximize the effectiveness of the rain barrel. You can either purchase your rain barrel from the Township or make your own.



PLANT TREES AND SHRUBS

Planting trees, shrubs and/or plants that have a deep root structure help stormwater infiltrate into the ground. They also catch rain water on their leaves and branches which helps to reduce the amount of run-off during a storm.

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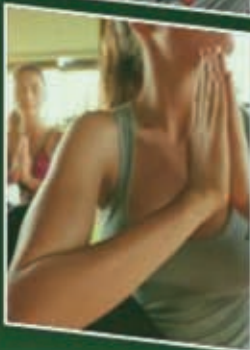
