

The Reynolds City Council met concurrently with the Budget Hearing in a regular session on October 7, 2024. The members present were Dorian Beck, David Schumacher, Brian Thompson, and Braden Majer, with Mayor David Scholand presiding. The minutes from the September 9, 2024, meeting were presented.

Public Works, Health & Safety: Sewer Report: Pump 1 ran 13 hours and Pump 2 ran 13 hours. The gazebo has been delivered, the cement has been poured and stamped. Tony Anderson requested a 75% advance on the work performed to date. The gazebo should be finished in the next two weeks. Brian Thompson motioned to approve the consent agenda, which was seconded by Braden Majer and passed unanimously.

Old Business:

Ostlie with Breidenbach Excavating will begin work on phase one of the ditching and drainage project this month. They will also complete the road between Morrison & 7th Avenue.

New Business:

Liz Hildebrand joined the meeting to discuss placing a little library on city property. After discussion, Brian Thompson made a motion to place the small library at City Hall. David Schumacher seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

An update was given on the new version of QuickBooks and the payment process. Residents will have the option to pay their utility bills online through QuickBooks. Fees are assessed after the payment has been processed.

The park will need to be winterized, with the water meters and garbage dumpster removed.

Dorian Beck made a motion to adjourn the meeting, which was seconded by David Schumacher, and passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 7:32 pm.
